Regional Skills Assessments (RSAs) are a single, agreed evidence base created to inform future investment in skills. This infographic is for West Lothian, and supplements the region's RSA Summary report. It uses Oxford Economics forecasts for the 2019-2029 period to show current and future economic contribution, as well as current and future demand for skills.



S3 Curriculum

Students will continue to study a **broad general education**, ensuring they still have a breadth and balance to their timetable

Mathematics, English and Modern Languages (usually French) remain compulsory along with Physical Education, Religious and Moral Education and Personal and Social Education as part of our core programme.

All students will study Scottish Studies Group Award over S3 at the highest possible level (SCQF 3 or 4) and will also select a Personal Achievement option from a wide menu, leading to a Personal Achievement award from a recognised body

Personalisation and Choice – drives engagement and allows greater depth of study

1x Social Subject

1x Science

1x Expressive Arts subject

1x Technologies subject

1x further choice from one of the above curriculum areas or from Health and Wellbeing or RME


